Administrative Information

Abstract
Papers 1841-1990 (bulk 1917-1961). Author, journalist. Manuscript materials including novels, short stories, journal articles, drafts, and fragments. The collection also includes outgoing and incoming correspondence, news clippings, scrapbooks, periodicals, books, objects, and assorted ephemera collected by Hemingway.

For example, selecting “The Sun Also Rises” will bring you to the item list for that book manuscript. Click on the plus mark (+) next to each entry to expand the description and view additional information about each item, where applicable. Clicking the same button again will collapse the description note.

Expanding the item will also reveal its identifier, such as EHPP-MS28-001 in the example below. This number combines the collection code, the box number, and the folder number.

"The Sun Also Rises" is a novel published by Scribner's in 1926. It was originally titled "Fiesta." The series includes the manuscript (written in several notebooks), as well as typescripts, carbon copies, and galleys.

Pages are numbered (2pp.), 1-25, 25-31. Early ink draft beginning "I saw him for the first time. . ." Typed on first page: "Facing Page one of Chapter One: "The graves a fine and secret place / But none I think do there embrace... Marvell." The second page lists the names of the characters in the book. Page 1 of the manuscript is headed "Cayetano Ordonez Nino de la Palma." Precedes notebooks. Facsimile in Brucoli. Folder contains 34pp. Young/Mann 18D.

At the top of the finding aid, directly under the heading “Container List,” there is a button that expands all item descriptions at the same time. Click on the plus mark (+) next to “Expand / Collapse All” to open every item description in the finding aid. NOTE: Due to the large amount of data being processed, this action may take a moment to complete.



Series 1. Manuscripts.
Extent: 31,248 cubic feet (62 boxes).
Arrangement: Divided into two subseries: Series 1.1. Book Manuscripts, and Series 1.2. Stories and Fragments Manuscripts.
This series includes manuscripts, typescripts, drafts, notes, and galleys for Hemingway's published and unpublished writings. Each item has an identification number to aid in retrieval and citation. An item may be only one page or as long as a complete novel draft. Manuscripts are arranged in two subseries: 1.1. Book Manuscripts (#1-222a) and 1.2. Stories and Fragments Manuscripts (#222b-859). Book Manuscripts includes all material pertaining to his published books, including both novels and collections of short stories. Stories and Fragments includes individual short stories, newspaper and magazine articles, poems, speeches, statements, and unaffiliated fragments.

Series 1.1. Books.
Extent: 16,632 cubic feet (33 boxes).
Arrangement: Numerical by item number; alphabetical by book title.
This subseries includes all manuscript materials (drafts, notes, typescripts, galleys) for Hemingway's published books. Both novels and collections of short stories are included. This subseries runs from item

Once all the items are expanded, you can perform a keyword search of the entire collection at once. Press Ctrl+F to bring up your browser's search box, then type in the term you would like to find. In the example below, we did a search for "Fitzgerald" and it has found this name 52 times throughout the finding aid.

You can also do keyword searches without expanding all the items, but this will only find words contained in folder titles and item titles. It will not find terms within the hidden descriptions.
